FROM THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO - LUKE-:

MEDITATION ON THE MYSTERY:

Mary, obtain for us the grace to be able to ask, as you did, *“What is the meaning of this greeting”* (cf. Luke 1:29) – or *“what is the meaning of this phrase in the Bible?”* (cf. Acts 8:30, 34); *“what is the meaning of this event?”* (cf. Acts 10:17); *“what is the meaning of this ‘coincidence’?”* (cf. John 4:52-53). (cf. SLC, p. 62)
