
In the 5th Joyful Mystery, we read and we meditate undisturbed:



"The finding of Jesus in the Temple"...

FROM THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO - LUKE-:

"Each year his parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover...[but] after they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it." $(Luke 2:41, 43)^1$

MEDITATION ON THE MYSTERY:

How could parents possibly lose a child? Only if they are distracted! – With this, Lord, we are not saying that St. Joseph and Mary were distracted; but if You permitted this scene to take place in the Gospel, it is to help us understand that even during religious celebrations it is possible to become distracted and to lose the most precious good: who is Jesus! (cf. SLC, p. 225)

FROM THE TEACHINGS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH:

- In regards to "getting lost" and religious celebrations, the Compendium of Social Doctrine of the Catholic Church says: "Christians, in respect of religious freedom and of the common good of all, should seek to have Sundays and the Church's Holy Days recognized as legal holidays.
