"The finding of Jesus" in the Temple"...

FROM THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO - LUKE -:

"Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it... After three days they found him in the temple... and his mother said to him, ... Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety.' And he said to them, 'Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must [be about my Father's business]?'" $(Luke 2:43-49)^{1}$

MEDITATION ON THE MYSTERY:

Give us the grace, Lord, to be able to say this, especially to all those parents distressed by the "loss" of their children (who have discovered their vocation or whom you have called): "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be about my Father's business?" (Luke 2:49). (cf. SLC, p. 227)

FROM THE TEACHINGS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH:

- In regards to divine vocation and earthly parents, Pope Francis writes: "Jesus is a model of obedience to earthly parents, placing himself under their charge (cf.
