FROM THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO - LUKE -:

"After they had completed [the days of the feast], ... Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it... After three days they found him in the temple... and his mother said to him,... Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety.' And he said to them, 'Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must [be about my Father's business]?'" (Luke 2:43-49)¹

Give us the grace to be able to say this, especially to all those parents distressed by the "loss" of their children, whom you have called: "This, in the name of the Lord, is what your child would say to you if he or she were here - 'Why are you searching for me? Don't you know that I have to be about my Father's business?' Reflect about this. If only all were as fortunate as you are!" (cf. SLC, p. 227)
