Lord, why did You allow Yourself to be crowned with thorns? What suffering You must have endured! Surely You want to help us understand that we, too, need to endure the "crown of thorns" which we often encounter during the trial of this brief life. Give us the grace to be able to imitate You in this, as well, because as St. Thérèse of Lisieux says, "Every thorn endured, could be a soul saved!" (cf. SLC, p. 309)

FROM THE TEACHINGS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH:

- In regards to accepting thorns with joy, Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati says: "You ask me if I am happy. How could I not be?... A Catholic could not be other than happy... The goal for which we were created involves a path which has its thorns, but it is not a sad path. It is joy, even when it involves pain."
